More women in political office



Challenge politics as a male domain

Public = male

Private = female

Acts of violence Sexism in media



Mechanisms to communicate that women do not belong in politics

EXAMPLES

- Murder or kidnapping (real or threat)
- Sexual assault (real or threat)
- Pressure and threats to resign
- Sexual harassment by colleagues
- Character assassination, incl. morality
- Sexualized, criticized as wives/mothers
- Denied resources; false information

VAW IN POLITICS

Explicit

- Physical violence
- →Murder, assault
- Psycholog'l violence
- →Intimidate, harass

Not reported, covered in media


Implicit

- Work environment
- →Routines, behaviors
- Media coverage
- →Criticism as woman

Naturalized, not questioned as such

KEY POINTS

- Recognize VAWIP in various versions
- → Why violence
- → How perpetrated
- Variety of actors
- Problem exists in all countries, esp. when define widely



Above and beyond 'political violence'

POLICY SOLUTIONS

- Laws on violence and harassment
- Support networks for elected women
- Call centers to report violence
- Sexual harassment policies
- Campaigns on sexism in media
- Training, recruiting female journalists
- Using social media to report, publicize

WHY THIS MATTERS

- Restricts women's legislative work
- Impacts women's political ambition
- Shapes and reflects views on women in society; perpetuates inequality
- Affects integrity of democracy
- →Who runs, how they perform; climate
